

What Does the PI/CPC Committee Do?

(from the Guidelines on PI)

Members of this committee carry the AA message to the alcoholic who still suffers by conveying AA information to the general public, including the media.

(from the guidelines on CPC)

Members of this committee also provide information about AA to those who have contact with alcoholics through their profession. This group includes healthcare, Employee Assistance Programs and Human Resources, professionals, educators, members of the clergy, lawyers, social workers, military professionals, government officials and those working in the field of alcoholism.

What Services Does the PI/CPC Committee Provide?

- Presentations about AA – length determined by the needs of the requesting facility or agency.
- Literature racks – Committee members will provide and maintain a literature rack of pertinent pamphlets about AA's program of recovery.
- Bridging the Gap Temporary Contact Program – Upon written request, AA members serve as temporary contacts and guides to newcomers released or discharged from correctional facilities and treatment programs
